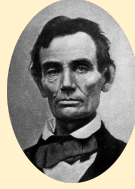

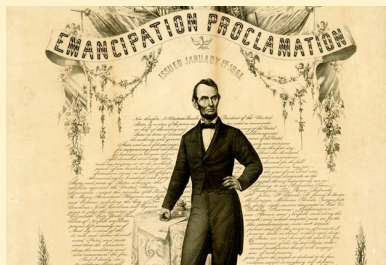

Presidential Policies:

1. [Gettysburg Address](#) - In November 19, 1964, a dedication to the Battle of Gettysburg in Gettysburg, PA for the land to become a national landmark cemetery.
2. [Emancipation Proclamation](#) - In January 1, 1863, an executive order to free all the slaves, only in rebellion states (Confederacy), not border states because the Union had a victory so it took the opportunity to free the slaves, but didn't want to free slaves in border states because he didn't want them to join the Confederacy.
